Culture classes (異文化体験教室)	Sendai International Friendship Club (仙台国際交流クラブ)	By giving foreign residents the chance to experience traditional Miyagi crafts and activities such as ink wash painting, painting <i>kokeshi</i> dolls, and painting <i>koma</i> spinning tops, these classes aimed to promote mutual understanding regardless of nationality, age or gender, and provide an opportunity to introduce foreign cultures to both Japanese and foreign residents.	44,000
Online seminars – Get to know Taiwan (オンラインセミナー 台湾を学ぶ)	Japan-Taiwan Friendship Club (日台友情のかけはしの会)	Two seminars were held online with the aim of promoting exchange between Japan and Taiwan, and nurturing the existing links between the two given the recent decline in international travel due to the COVID-19 pandemic. These classes became a chance for participants to strengthen their desire for peace and friendship, and contributed to greater international understanding and multiculturalism in the region.	100,000
Decorate Sendai and make Tanabata an international festival! (International 仙台七夕を作って七夕まつりに飾ろう!)	Date Creators (伊達クリエイターズ)	A series of events were held during the Sendai Tanabata festival where foreign and Japanese residents worked together to create Tanabata decorations with an international twist, decorated them around the shopping streets of Ichibancho and cleaned up afterwards. Those that took part got to know people from different cultures via the Tanabata festival, and participants included both Japanese and foreign residents, as well as many of the young generation that will lead Sendai's next generation.	100,000
Online course for supporting Chinese residents (在住中国人支援オンライン講座)	Miyagi Chinese Women Community Group (宮城華僑華人女性聯誼会)	Chinese classes for children as well as classes on inheritance law for adults were held online with the aim of promoting online activities in order to support Chinese residents during the COVID-19 pandemic. During this fiscal year, offline activities were also held to give participants the chance to network with each other.	100,000
Symposium on the Project for Assisting the Establishment of a Kiribati Non-governmental UNESCO Association (キリバス民間ユネスコ協会設立支援プロジェクト シンポジウム)	Sendai UNESCO Association (公益社団法人仙台ユネスコ協会)	An online citizens' exchange event was held to heighten awareness of living a sustainable lifestyle and interest in SDGs through exchange with Kiribati and understanding climate change as an issue that impacts us all. Another objective of the event was to inspire enthusiasm to work alongside the planned non-governmental UNESCO Association in the Republic of Kiribati, and raise citizens' awareness of the significance of non-governmental UNESCO activities.	100,000
