

Disposing of Bulky Waste



When moving homes or to another country, you might find you're left with a lot of items to dispose of.

Items such as large pieces of furniture must be disposed of as 'bulky waste.' In addition you'll also need to know about how to dispose of items such as televisions, refrigerators, and other large home appliances.

What is bulky waste?

Bulky waste is items which measure more than 30 centimeters and weigh up to 100 kg.

Ex. Sofa/couches, beds, storage cases, etc.

Things to be careful of

- * The days that bulky waste are collected are predetermined. When applying to have bulky waste collected it cannot be collected immediately. It's best to apply at the earliest point possible.
- If you are moving or having a big clean out of your home and will be disposing of a large amount of garbage, you can apply to have the waste collected or take it to a waste disposal site on your own.

Advisor Corner "Differences in Waste Disposal" Thoughts and experiences from advisors on this issue's theme

Before moving to Japan, I never gave very much thought to the garbage that I put in the trash can every day. I did my best to recycle newspapers and aluminum cans, and tried not to be too wasteful, although to be honest if I wanted to I could have just thrown everything in the same bag.

This naïve way of thinking changed when I made my way out to the land of the rising sun and got a look at the guide for how to sort recyclables and waste made by the City of Sendai. No longer was I able to simply toss whatever in the garbage without a second thought; the simple act of getting rid of waste became a type of mental exercise that certainly caused me some wonderful culture shock.

Batteries, cooking oil, electronic equipment, candy bar wrappers, diapers. Each had a

different, hard-to-remember method of disposal. It made we wonder just how long it would take for me to remember everything written in the guide. But as I saw fellow citizens at my apartment, work place, and restaurants doing their best for the environment, I gained the courage to overcome the difficulty of separating garbage in Sendai.

I was able to gradually absorb the required knowledge while referring to the guide while throwing away my waste, eventually coming to master sorting everything after many months. While it's enough information to make your head spin at first, I'm sure that those reading this article will also be able to remember everything if they give it their best.

How to apply for bulky waste collection

- 1. Make an application to the Bulky Waste Reception Center
 - ① Application by telephone

Call after measuring the size (length, width, height) of the waste. The operator will then tell you the collection date, collection fee, and any additional preparations that you may need to make (application number, location to leave the bulky waste, etc.).

[Cautions]

Only certain items can be applied for online. Please confirm them on the website. Information about pickup date, fee payment, and preparation required for pickup is also written there. Please be sure to read this information carefully before applying. Waste may not be collected if there are errors during this process.



2. Pay the fee

Please purchase the "Bulky Waste Disposal Fee Prepaid Label" (sticker) at stores that display a sign as shown on the top-right, such as a convenience store, for the amount you were told when you applied for pickup.

* The "Bulky Waste Disposal Fee Prepaid Label" cannot be refunded or reissued.

3. Put out the waste for collection

Please write your application number on the "Bulky Waste Disposal Fee Prepaid Label." Stick it in a place on the bulky waste where it can be easily seen. Put your bulky waste out by 8:30 a.m. on the morning of the pickup day at the appointed place you were told when you applied for pickup.

- * If there is no application number written on the sticker, the waste will not be collected.
- Costs for disposal differ from item to item.
 Make sure to confirm the correct cost for disposal at the time of application.

Items that are not bulky waste

Home appliances such as televisions, refrigerators, air conditioners, and washing machines etc. are not bulky waste.

They must be collected for recycling by manufacturers. There is a fee for transportation and recycling of such items. (Stipulated by law.)

Where to apply:

- ① The retailer that you bought the appliance from or are buying its replacement from.
- ② If you do not know where the item was purchased, you can have it collected by Sendai City licensed waste haulers
- Computers are also not bulky waste. Confirm how to dispose of the item with the manufacturer. You can also contact Sendai City licensed waste haulers if you are unsure of the make of the computer.
- Sendai City licensed waste haulers differ by ward of residence. Please see the back page of the 'Guide for Sorting Recyclables and Waste and How to Put Them Out for Collection' pamphlet below for details.
